

VILLAGE OF SCHILLER PARK – LICENSE COMMITTEE MINUTES OF 8/23/2016

Call to Order:

Chairman Fritz called the meeting to Order at 6:30 p.m.

Roll Call:

Present: Trustee Fritz, Trustee Gorzynski and Trustee Diaz

Approval of Minutes:

Motion by Diaz, second by Gorzynski, to approve the 8/1/16 minutes as presented. Passed

Liquor License Application – Class “C”:

Chairman Fritz referred to the submittal from D.T Grey Fletcher on behalf of Hamilton West d/b/a Martini Black Bartending. He asked that the form be re-submitted because lines for a corporation and partnership were filled in. It needs to be one or the other. Also, he requested the missing exhibits to the rental agreement. Applicant Fletcher said his business is full-service catering, liquor stored on premises, has a lease with My Kitchens, holds a State catering & liquor license, food is prepared on-site, and liquor is picked-up and delivered on-site. There is to be no liquor served on the propose site. Fletcher said employees were trained through BASSET. Trustee Fritz asked for a list of personnel indicating that they are certified in BASSET. Applicant Fletcher explained the FBI background findings regarding a past misdemeanor and traffic convictions. After the applicant departed, there was further discussion on the merits.

Motion by Diaz, second by Gorzynski, to recommend to the Village Board an increase in Class “C” licenses by one. Failed. Consensus of the Committee was to convene another meeting on this topic.

Old Business:

- 1) Further Review of Liquor Ordinance: Trustee Fritz asked that the pending ordinance amendment be revised to address dancing in establishments. Attorney Abel said this was an area of the law that is difficult, if not impossible, to regulate.
- 2) BASSET: Consensus of the Committee was not to create a local regulation of training. It would be redundant to State law and create an unnecessary administrative burden. This item was removed from further consideration.
- 3) Gaming Parlor License: Consensus of the Committee was to ask Attorney Abel to research and
