Mayor's Update



Summer has kicked off in town and we've already had some great events. Back in May we had our annual induction of military vets on our Wall of Honor, the pool opened on May 23rd (although the weather didn't cooperate,) we had our first Village wide garage sale on the 29th and 30th (again the weather wasn't very cooperative,) our first 5K Dog Walk on June 6th (weather was perrrrfect,) and our Concerts in the Park series had its first event on June 12th. You'll see some of the pictures from the events posted on our Facebook Page and website.

We hope more residents will come out for the Concerts in the Park and Movies in the Park events. These are family friendly, FREE events offered to our residents that encourage community spirit. Although this newsletter will probably not be out until after the 4th of July, I'm looking forward to having our 2nd annual (last year we had our Centennial Parade) Kids Bike and Pet Parade/Picnic. I love seeing how the kids decorate their bikes and pet parents dress up their pets!

O'HARE UPDATE

On June 3rd, I attended the Suburban O'Hare Commission (SOC) meeting where we heard for the first time from some of the experts that were hired to address the O'Hare environmental and noise impact on our communities. Although the experts projected new runways for O'Hare wouldn't be needed until at least 2034, SOC members were hesitant to embrace that only because if diagonal runways were to close, new runways might actually ease the noise burden. However, more studies have to be completed. Right now though, everyone was in agreement that the diagonal runways need to stay open.

SOC did agree with their experts on a finding that the noise contour or "65 DNL Zone" underestimates the impact of the new flight paths. They said "flawed" metrics were used and information was not based on "international scientific standards." Many of our residents who now are living with increased jet noise live outside of the "noise contour." Although soundproofing won't help when you are outside, it sure could make a difference indoors, and I believe all of Schiller Park should be entitled to soundproofing.

The Chicago Sun Times reported on June 7th that Chicago Aviation Commissioner Ginger Evans is not prepared to sign on to the FAiR Allocation in Runways (FAiR) Coalition's demands for fair and equitable distribution of air traffic both day and night, saving diagonal runways and Fly Quiet. Evans is holding opinion until the three public hearings demanded by state legislators take place and she has an opportunity to evaluate proposals from her staff, SOC, and FAiR both for noise benefits and also for any impacts on the airport's operation.

The Village website, www.villageofschillerpark.com, has been updated with a lot of information that was brought back from the O'Hare Noise

Commission Meeting. You'll find noise complaint data and information on the Chicago Department of Aviation's new website at ohare.com. There is a new "flight tracker" app that allows the public (to see in delayed time) where planes are coming in from.

I will keep you abreast of any new developments.

COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING – Town Hall Meeting

The biggest project that needs to be addressed in Schiller Park is a good comprehensive plan that would not only include focusing on new businesses and development, but also planning for new infrastructure, flood relief and better use of village properties; a plan that is long overdue. The mayor has her vision but she'd like to hear what residents would like to see happen in our town.

One step to address flooding can be found in this Schillergram with the flooding survey we are asking residents to fill out. This will help us plan for flood relief projects and see what kind of money will be needed to do repairs. This has long been on the Mayor's agenda to address with a solid plan.

Another step in the plan is hopefully in the works with having the Public Building Commission, an independent government agency, come in and provide leadership, expertise, service and support Village vision for the capital projects and programs. We are looking forward to working with them.

However, the exciting part is envisioning what Schiller Park could look like in the future and putting our thoughts and ideas on paper. To that end, the Mayor is holding a Town Hall Meeting at 7:00 pm on August 12th at the community center to get positive input from residents on what they would like to see happen along with how they feel about ideas the Village has for improvements. We want this to be a team effort and again a positive one. If you know of students of architecture or engineering that would like to contribute their thoughts, we'd love to have them! Fresh, new ideas – that is what Schiller Park needs!

The Mayor and Village Board would like to invite you to the Community Center to hear your thoughts and ideas on upcoming projects and development. What's important to you?

Grilling Safety

There is nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They are very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on your way to safe grilling.

Safety Tips

- Propane and charcoal grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in the trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

Charcoal Grills


- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid away from children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Propane Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your gas grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill.

If the flame **goes out**, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 15 minutes before re-lighting it.

July is the peak month for grill fires with roughly half the injuries involving grills being thermal burns.

Enjoy full day of racing and support a great cause at the inaugural Gift From the Heart Grand Prix in Schiller Park.



Mosquito Season Is Upon Us

Along with the return of mosquitoes comes the risk of West Nile Virus (“WNV”). Over the past number of years Illinois has continued to experience cases of WNV and it remains a public health concern.

The house mosquito (*Culex pipiens*) and related species of *Culex* are the primary carriers of WNV. They breed in stagnant water with heavy organic content and hot summer temperatures increase *Culex* mosquito production. Most house mosquitoes in a community are produced locally. The *Culex* mosquito doesn’t fly more than 2 miles from its original breeding site.

Schiller Park, like many other area communities, helps fund a mosquito control program administered by Leyden Township to help keep mosquito populations to a minimum. Our businesses and residents can assist with this effort.

To help reduce the mosquito population, check your property and follow these suggestions:

Remove anything and everything that can hold water.

Remove or empty water in old tires, tin cans, buckets, drums, bottles or other places where mosquitoes might breed.

Empty plastic wading pools at least once a week and store indoors when not in use. If unused, drain swimming pools and keep dry during mosquito season.

Change water weekly in bird baths, plant saucers and trays.

Store boats and other equipment covered or upside down and remove rainwater weekly.

Water bowls used by pets should be emptied and refilled daily.

Fill holes around homes, businesses and parking lots that may retain water.

Keep gutters around homes and businesses in good repair to avoid water build-up.

Keep weeds and grass cut short. Adult mosquitoes look for shady places to rest during hot daylight hours.

Be sure screens in homes and businesses are intact and tight fitting to prevent entry of insects.

Personal Protection

Apply mosquito repellent containing not more than 30% DEET primarily to clothing. Follow directions on container especially with regard to children.

Keep skin covered when traveling through wooded areas. Wear long-sleeved shirts, pants and socks.

If at all possible, stay indoors at dawn and at dusk.

Public Works



BRANCH COLLECTION

Branch pickup services are provided by the Village Public Works Department during the spring, summer, and fall. This program is offered to provide residents a way to dispose of branches resulting from routine pruning of privately owned trees. This program does not include removing large limbs or trunks from tree removals. Public Works begins the process of picking up branches on Monday mornings starting at 7:00 AM. If your branches are put out after the crew has gone by they will not return until the next scheduled collection. In order to ensure your branches are picked up please adhere to the following guidelines:



Collection Guidelines

- Branches must be on the parkway by 7:00 am on Monday morning.
- Branches must be 2 feet or longer, cleanly cut (without roots), and bundled with cut ends pointing to the curb.
- Branches must be smaller than 8 inches in diameter (measured at the cut end).
- Branches should not obstruct sidewalks or streets.

Lane Marking Program

The Public Works Department has begun the inaugural in-house lane marking program. Staff will be refreshing crosswalks and stop bars on local roads throughout the Village. This program is designed to improve safety on local roads for vehicles and pedestrians as well as improve the overall appearance of Schiller Park



Electronics Recycling

Electronic items should not be placed at the curb with the trash. These items will not be collected by Groot unless you pay an extra fee in advance. Village of Schiller Park residents may drop off E-Waste items at the storage container behind the Street Garage located at 9526 West Irving Park Road; Schiller Park, IL 7 days a week during day light hours.

Electric Aggregation Program Update



Following the passage of a 2012 voter referendum by a majority of voters, the Village of Schiller Park contracted to procure lower-cost electric supply for residents and small businesses. In the first two-year term ending July 2014, the average participating homeowner saved roughly \$288 for a cumulative Village savings of about \$836,000.

The Village suspended the program in 2014 after rejecting the bids – all of which came in above the current ComEd rate. After seeking competitive bids this Spring, the Village accepted a bid from Dynegy Energy to restart its program at meter read dates in September 2015. The rate is fixed at 6.851¢ per kWh for the first 12 months, and steps down to a fixed rate of 6.390¢ per kWh for the last 12 months of the two-year term, which ends September 2017.

electric supply charges from Dynegy. ComEd will continue to charge for delivery. The way you pay your bill, such as budget billing or automatic payment will not be affected.

The era of substantial savings versus the ComEd rate has passed for the time being. This program presents several benefits: ratepayers enjoy the flexibility to join or leave the program with no termination fee; residents receive a fixed, known rate versus the ComEd PTC which is re-set at least twice annually and can further change with the PEA charge that may vary from month to month; residents are likely to save money versus the ComEd rate.

Electric deregulation has been met with great success in the State of Illinois, saving ratepayers billions of dollars: Residents were charged 9¢ per kWh for electric supply in the summer of 2010, and Illinois rates were near the highest levels in the nation in the 1990s and through the early 2000s. However, today Illinois electric rates are among the lowest in the nation, with many Midwestern states such as Michigan and Wisconsin, paying higher rates than in Illinois.

Electric Aggregation Program FAQs

How can I enroll in the program?

During the initial three-week opt out period, you need do nothing if you have an eligible resident or small commercial electric account; you will automatically be enrolled unless you opt out. After the initial opt out period, any residential or small business ratepayer may enroll by simply calling Dynegy at 844-351-7691 and asking for the Village of Schiller Park rate of 6.851¢ which steps down to 6.390¢ in the second year.

What is an eligible resident or small commercial account?

Any resident who is currently with ComEd and has not already switched to an Alternative Retail Electric Supplier (ARES) or who is not enrolled in a special Residential Real-Time Pricing (RRTP) program is eligible, and small commercial accounts are eligible. You must also have a residence or business located in the Village of Schiller Park.

What is a “small commercial account?”

A small commercial account is a business rate class account that consumes less than 15,000 kWh per year.

What if I don’t want to be in the program?

You may opt out before the program begins or after you are enrolled, for no fee. Eligible resident and small commercial accounts will receive an opt out letter to which they must respond by the deadline stated if they do not want to be in the program. Otherwise, they will automatically be enrolled. If you want to leave the program after having been enrolled, simply call Dynegy to be move back to ComEd at any time.

I am located in Schiller Park’s Village limits, have already switched to another Supplier, but would like to join the program. Can I do this?

Yes. You will receive an informative notice with information on how to enroll, should you choose to do so. Or call Dynegy at 844-351-7691 to

All residents and small commercial retail accounts located within the Village limits will automatically be enrolled unless they:

1. Choose to opt out as directed in the opt out notice; or
2. Have already switched to another Supplier; or
3. Participate in the Residential Real-Time Pricing (RRTP) hourly-rate program

Opt out notices will be mail dropped to eligible ratepayers in June. There is no enrollment fee and no early termination fee to vacate the program at any time. Informative opt-in notices will also be mailed to all ratepayers currently enrolled with a supplier other than the Village’s program.

Residents already enrolled with another Alternative Retail Electric Supplier will receive an informative notice with directions how to enroll if they choose to do so. Because these ratepayers are already engaged in a contract with a Supplier, they will not be automatically enrolled in the Village’s program but must call Dynegy at 844-351-7691 to opt in.

Residents will continue to receive one bill from ComEd to include the

² The ComEd Price to Compare is 7.033¢ in September 2015 and rises in October 2015 to a rate yet to be announced but estimated by the ICC as 7.173¢; current rates may be found at www.pluginillinois.org by adding the Electric Supply Charge and the Transmission Services Charge.

enroll and provide them with your ComEd account number. We suggest you check your individual contract to review any early termination fees you may be liable for; you may wish to wait for your current contract to expire before enrolling in the aggregation program. You may join the program at any time during the 24-month contract, for no fee.

Why is the Village doing this?

A Municipal Electric Aggregation Program was approved by a simple majority in a voter referendum allowing the Village to seek pricing from an ARES for residents and small commercial accounts.

Are other municipalities doing this?

Yes. Over 650 municipalities across the State of Illinois have established electric aggregation programs. Residents have enjoyed savings, flexibility and fixed rate stability (a guaranteed “cap” rate) versus the ComEd rate, which is re-set once or twice a year, and can be somewhat volatile from month-to-month. Millions of Illinois residents are enrolled in similar programs across the State.
