Update on Airport Noise Contours and Sound Insulation Options

The Village continues to be an active participant with both the Suburban O'Hare Commission (SOC) and the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (ONCC) to ensure that our concerns are heard. I will also continue to have one-on-one meetings with the Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) and ONCC staff regarding aircraft noise. It is important to know how the airport plans to continue to address noise issues.

In 2005, the contours outlined in blue below were the designated sound insulation areas for homes. Homes within the boundary of the blue contours were eligible to participate in the sound insulation program. Looking at the map you will see two peak contours identified as C and D that affect Schiller Park. The B contour (north of Schiller Park) is the largest because in 2005 Runways 9R/27L (being extended) was slated to receive the bulk of night travel. Over the years


the number of noise complaints at O'Hare increased substantially as new runways were built as part of the O'Hare Modernization Program (OMP). As a result, the ONCC, along with the CDA, recommended a temporary runway rotation program, which is currently under FAA review.


Runway 9C/27C and the Runway 9R/27L extension are scheduled to be completed by 2021. Many communities do not want 27C and 27L to open as it will shift noise from Schiller Park to other towns. We need these runways to open because larger aircraft can use them, providing our Village much needed relief. Currently, the longest and the closest runway to the terminals, 28R is just south of River Street; 28C is almost in line with Lawrence Avenue; and 28L is closer to Irving Park Road. These runways put planes directly over Schiller Park.

Runway 10L/28R is the workhorse of the airport due to its length and proximity to the terminals. This means the most utilized runway is directly over Schiller Park.

Once the extension of Runway 9R/27L is completed and all the runways are open, the noise contours (the blue line around

the airport) will be recalculated in order to produce another contour map. At that time, additional residential sound insulation may be offered. Any claim that the new contour map is finalized is not correct. Until then, the only additional sound insulation that will occur will be to those homes that opted out or refused to participate in a prior year and enroll in upcoming Phases 18 and 19. These homes were qualified for sound insulation years ago and will be re-invited to participate. There are 209 homes remaining to be insulated in Schiller Park, 120 of which have enrolled. The Village believes that these homeowners could benefit from sound insulation and encourages them to thoroughly review the program.

The Village has requested tax credits much like those given for energy efficient windows, doors and appliances. We will continue to think outside the box to get the most relief possible.

Branch Pick-up and Yard Waste Collection Has Begun

Throughout the spring, summer and fall months, the Village's Public Works Department will pick-up branches and yard waste from homes.

Branches and brush must be placed at the curb by 7 AM every Monday. Crews may require more than one day to complete Village-wide pick-up. Collected branches are turned into woodchips which are used in Village landscaping. If you need woodchips, call Public Works at 847-671-8554.

The following requirements should be noted:

- Only branches from trees and bushes (up to eight inches in diameter at the cut end) will be eligible for pick-up. Branches may be any length, though the ends must be cleanly cut with no attached root systems.
- Branches are to be neatly placed curbside, with cut ends facing toward the street. Unorganized or tangled brush piles will not be collected and the resident will be asked to re-stack the pile.
- Items larger than eight inches in diameter, materials such as construction wood, branches with nails or spikes, wooden fence pieces/doors, firewood logs, rose bushes, poison ivy, small hedge/ evergreen trimmings, and yard rakings cannot be mulched and must be disposed of by the resident through other means.
- Brush pick-up at any one residence will be limited to approximately 100 square feet of front area along the parkway (approximately six feet high by 17 feet long).

Through November, the Village's garbage contractor will pick-up yard waste on Fridays, along with trash and recycling. Yard waste must be put out in 32 gallon containers marked with at least two Village yard waste stickers or in biodegradable paper bags which are folded at the top. Yard waste that is too large for bags, such as branches or brush, may be tied up using biodegradable twine and left at the curb with other yard waste.

Schiller Park Makes "Safest Cities in Illinois" List

Schiller Park has been rated as one of the safest cities in Illinois in a recent study by the National Council for Home Safety & Security. In fact, our town ranked 32nd on the list of 112 cities that were included, placing Schiller Park in the top 30 percent! Thank you to our Police Department and other first responders for their hard work in helping to keep our community safe!

Street Sweeping Scheduled for Mondays and Tuesdays

The Village has begun a regular schedule of street sweeping to run through October. The sweeping occurs on designated Mondays for the even-numbered side of the street and on designated Tuesdays for the odd-numbered side of the street. Please check signs posted on your block that indicate parking is prohibited on the side of the street that will be swept that day. Please note that failure to obey these signs may result in a parking citation.

Hydrant Flushing Begins May 1

The Schiller Park Fire Department will begin to flush and flow fire hydrants to exercise the valves, clean out debris in the barrel of the hydrant and to identify potential repairs.

The Fire Department has placed blue reflective tape on hydrant barrels, collars or bonnets to help fire personnel to locate a hydrant after dark. If a hydrant near you needs the reflective tape to be replaced, please contact Lt. Budnik at 847-678-5136. This year, the Fire Department will also add a yellow tag to hydrants to indicate when it was flushed, flowed or repaired.
