The Center for Disability & Elder Law's CARES Act program provides **FREE legal services** to qualifying individuals on the below legal matters:

- **Housing:** Eviction Defense; Security Deposit Disputes; Co-Owner Disputes; Foreclosures; Property Taxes; Title Correction; Landlord/Tenant Disputes; Building Code Violation Defense; Landlord-side Evictions
 - *Qualifications:* The individual must reside in or have the dispute in suburban Cook County.

- **End of Life Planning:** Last Will and Testament; Power of Attorney; Living Will Declaration; Illinois Transfer on Death Instrument
 - *Qualifications:* The individual must be an Illinois resident.

- **Consumer Disputes:** Consumer Fraud; Elder Financial Abuse; Collections
 - *Qualifications:* The individual must reside in or have the dispute in suburban Cook County.

- **Simple Divorces**
 - *Qualifications:* The individual must reside in or have the dispute in suburban Cook County. The divorce must not involve minor children or jointly owned real property.

- **Adult Guardianship**
 - *Qualifications:* Must seek guardianship over a person, not an estate. The individual that guardianship is sought over must reside in suburban Cook County.
