## “911, What’s your Emergency?”

Our current reporting period covers the activities that Schiller Park responded to in the last month. The following incidents are the firefighters and paramedics more unique calls. As always Schiller Park members responded to any call for help.

This month we begin on June 13<sup>th</sup> when Red shift responded to a fire alarm in a motel. Upon arrival members searched the stricken area and found that water had leaked in the basement and into a detector.

On June 17<sup>th</sup> a fire alarm in the business had Gold shift respond. On scene members found the owner of the business burning Sage because she had potential buyers of her business come into her office and she felt that they left bad vibes. She was told by a friend that burning sage would get rid of bad spirits. It did set off the fire alarm, we are not sure if it cleared the bad voodoo.

Their next shift on the 17<sup>th</sup> had members respond to persons stuck in an elevator. Members gained access to remove any occupants.

Red shift responded to the toll way gas station on June 19<sup>th</sup>. The call was for a fuel spill. On scene FF/PM Schneider the acting officer found a woman who stated that she was filling her car with gas when she moved the hose to open the back door. The hose became dislodge and sprayed her with car and the interior of the car. There was also a pool of gas on the ground.

The next call was for a person locked out of their house. She accidentally closed the door without taking her keys. Members were able to verify her residence and get her inside.

Gold shift took in an automatic fire alarm on June 20<sup>th</sup>. Investigating the alarm, members found a loose Pull Station in the rear building that was tripped.

A reported fire on June 22<sup>nd</sup> found

Black shift respond to a business in town. On scene it was discovered that a large fire pit was going and the occupants were burning rubbish. The fire was put out with 500m gallons of water.

June 23<sup>rd</sup> had Gold shift response to a motor vehicle accident. Lt. Budnik requested a second ambulance from Franklin Park when it was determined that there were multiple victims involved. Members then assisted the ambulance and transports made to Gottlieb Memorial Hospital.

Cmdr. Leiser responded to a call on June 25<sup>th</sup> for a trouble alarm. On scene he found that the alarm was initiated when the occupant was trying to hook up a generator to the building to support the phones and alarm system because the power went out.

A pull station that was activated on June 26<sup>th</sup> had Cmdr. Maher and the crew respond. Their investigation found it to be malicious.

A Working Fire June 28<sup>th</sup> in Leyden had Battalion 5 and Tower Ladder 5 respond. On scene of the apartment building members assisted in removing seven persons from the second floor using ground ladders. They then continued their primary search and rescue. Black shift then assisted Incident Command.

Cmdr. Maher and Red shift were dispatched on June 29<sup>th</sup> for a motorcycle crash. They were on a previous fire alarm call so he released one ambulance and diverted Norwood Park Engine 101 to that scene.

The month ended with two calls for Black shift. The first was for a rubbish fire. Tower ladder 5 was first on scene and found that the rubbish extended to mulch and landscaping material. They used their pressurized water cans until Engine 5 arrived from previous call. The engine used 250 gallons of water on the smoldering fire.

Their next call came in for two persons who were sick from eating

mushrooms from their yard. Cmdr. Leiser made the decision to immediately send two ambulances to the scene. Upon arrival our members found that two persons were violently ill and had been vomiting and had diarrhea as a result of ingestion the mushrooms. Both persons were transported to a level one trauma center for the possible poisoning.

July began on the 1<sup>st</sup> with Black shift again responding to an ambulance call. The call required an additional firefighter to respond as a driver while both paramedics treated the patient.

Black shifts next tour of duty on July 3<sup>rd</sup> was an activated fire alarm. Members who responded found that it was due to a smoke detector over the microwave where tenants had burnt popcorn.

The 4<sup>th</sup> of July had Black shift take in a carbon monoxide incident. Monitoring the area the highest concentration was 20 ppm. Lt. Hatcher advised the occupants of the reading, changing the battery and ventilation in the area.

Lt. Cesaretti and Red shift took in a car fire on the 7<sup>th</sup>. On scene our crew found a SUV with hood open and engine compartment on fire. The "trash line" was pulled and 300 gallons of water. The driver stated he was driving when the power steering stopped and he noticed smoke under the hood. When opening the hood he found small fire and he left to call 9-1-1. Upon his return fire had engulfed engine compartment.

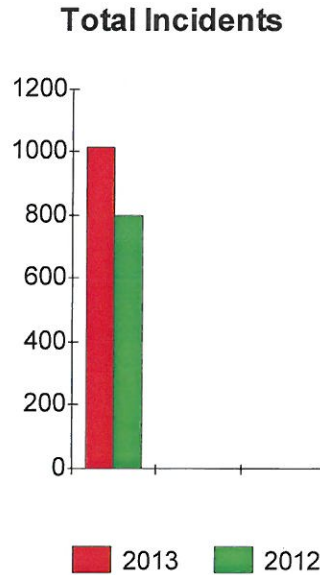
July 9<sup>th</sup> had an ambulance call for a person with their arm caught in a car window. Black shift arrived on scene to find a small boy with his skin wedged between the window and the trim on the door. Members were able to gently pry the door and window from his arm and free the boy. Mom and boy were relieved.

A fire alarm on July 10<sup>th</sup> found Black shift take in the call and a pull station in the apartment building pulled.

The last call of the reporting period was responded to on July 12<sup>th</sup> with

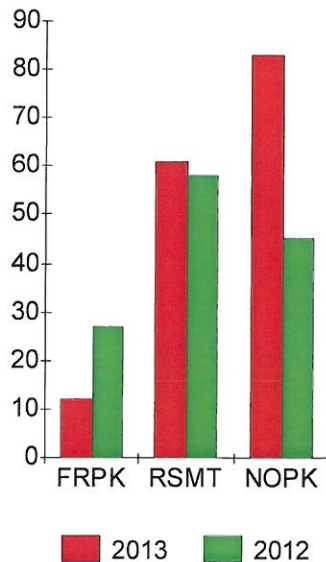
Gold shift helping a resident who received new oxygen tanks but they did not know how to hook them up. Members assisted the resident with the connection.

The following is the total run count compared with the same reporting period from 2012:



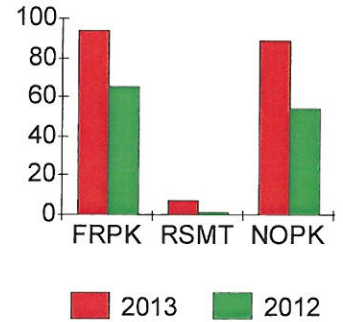

## Commander's Cove

### *We Stagnate When Caution Prevails*

FF/PM Rupsis returned from extended medical leave this past month. He has returned to Black shift on June 15<sup>th</sup>.

We are also entering the summer parade season. Our first parade was North Lake daze on the 26<sup>th</sup> of June. Cmdr Chiodo and his kids represented Schiller Park.

As a result of a save by members of Gold shift, (reported in last months issue), they have been nominated to receive the Department's Unit

Performance Award. This will be presented to Cmdr. Leiser, Lt. Budnik, FF/PM Swiontek, FF/PM Bertoncini, FF/PM Farias, FF/PM Santiago, FF/PM Warden and PM Zydlow at a Village Board meeting.

The water main construction on Kolze has been completed. This project replaced water mains and resurfaced the road.

Lt. Budnik has updated our Master Index List of forms in the Kitchen. Please use these forms only when in need of a form. If you have any others that need to be added to the Master Index, please see Lt. Budnik.

Fr. Schultz, our fire department chaplain, is competing in the Racine Ironman competition. It consists of 1.2 mile swim, 56 mile bike ride, and a 13.1 mile run. The proceeds will go to the St. Beatrice Catholic Appeal Debt Reduction Program. Any help you can give him by sponsoring him would be appreciated.

NORCOMM has issued the 2013-2014 Division Box Cards. All the cards in the Kitchen MABAS book have been updated. Electronic copies are on the Shift Officers computers.

Franklin Park has repaved Green street west of Mannheim. As those on the truck know that stretch had become a battlefield with potholes. With re-surfacing our response times for automatic aid to their western half of their town will decrease.

The NFPA has reported that firefighter line of duty deaths (LODD's) totaled 64 for all of 2012. This is the second year that LODD have declined. For the last four years the annual total has been under 100. Over the last 10 years firefighter fatalities have averaged 88.

The Village has also sold the International ambulance old 463. The

Village received over \$9,000 for the used ambulance. It was picked up on July 14<sup>th</sup> (see photos). It was sold and will be shipped to Chile where it will serve a mining community.

Our best wishes to part time 9-1-1 dispatcher Franco Bottalico who resigned this past month to take a police officer job in Franklin Park. He was replaced by dispatcher Colleen Termine. She is also a dispatcher in River Grove.

A new Public Works Director was named by the Mayor. John Piltaver takes over as the Director replacing Acting Director Bursiek. A new Community Development Director was also named John.

Lt. Budnik has provided each shift with the 2013 list of hydrants to be flowed. We will only flush them this year and NOT test flow. Please make sure that all hydrants have a 2" wide blue reflective band on the barrel and a 1" band on the steamer port. This aids in locating them in the dark.

The U.S. Department of Transportation has given final approval for the Elgin-O'Hare western access project. Part of the project will also be the ring road by-pass for the toll way. The project and infra structure will start shortly.

With the Village of Schiller Park entering its' Centennial year, the fire department will be issuing Centennial throwback Badges in the near future.

IDOT has approved funding for the widening of Mannheim from Irving north to the Kennedy. Work has already begun. Eventually a southbound ramp from Mannheim to Balmoral will be added for access to southbound I-294. Later this summer the Balmoral bridge over I-294 northbound will be re-built after a dump truck had its trailer unexpectedly rise and crash into the bridge doing extensive damage.

We are looking at getting voluntary compliance with numbering or lettering the stairways in our multi-story buildings. This would aid residents and firefighters in identifying the fire attack and evacuation stairways.

Another project is to identify which elevators our stretchers can be fit in by placing a Star of Life on the elevator(s) that we can get our stretcher into. A blue bar under the Star of Life will indicate that the stretcher can be fully vertical in the elevator.

Lastly, our thanks to Mayor Piltaver and Police Chief Brzezniak for having lunch with the firefighters.

## Tools / Equipment and Other FYI's

A number of items have been worked on this past month.

Items worked on and happenings around the firehouse this month include:

Members re-built bench in front of the firehouse use composite plastic "lumber". By using the recycled plastic milk bottles we strive to be "Green" and not use natural resources. This materials will also outlast the wood previous used and in need of replacement.

We also replaced the rear firehouse door locking mechanism. You will now have three methods to gain access to the firehouse—Keycard, Fob, or your four digit PIN. If you need access see FF/PM Bubis.

The west wall of the apparatus floor where the overhead doors were has been taped, mudded and painted to match the rest of the apparatus floor.

During hose testing this past month, we replaced all the three inch hose on Engine 6 with 2 ½ inch hose. This completes the transformation and

standardizes all our rigs for attack line. We will maintain 5 lengths of 3" for pump testing. They have been marked accordingly.

Engine 5 had several preventative maintenance issues taken care of this past month. The front latch on the hood was repaired by Tony Calefati. The vehicle also had all its tires replaced due to wear. Global products (Pierce trucks rep) also came in and replaced all the locking latches on the engine which were recalled. Tony found a coolant leak that required ordering additional parts. This should be completed by our next issue. The shoreline was repaired in the firehouse for Engine 5 and the thermal imaging camera was returned from Air One/MSA after the screen images became distorted. The Sensit Gold monitor on Engine 5 was taken out of service for not calibrating. The one from the Tower is temporarily moved to the engine. The rocker panel for extrication has been taken out of service and it was deemed unsafe.

Squad 5 had its shoreline lengthened to reach the connection and not interfere with the ceiling fan. It also had its batteries replaced by Tony along with the serpentine belt. It was also noted that the air conditioning unit was not working. Tony has checked this and determined that it needs to go out for repair.

We have added a triple hitch to Battalion 5. This will allow us to tow MABAS equipment when necessary. The three sizes also will allow us to move other specialized equipment.

A five gallon cooler was also added to Tower Ladder 5 for re-habilitation purposes.

## EMS Briefs

Just an update on activities within the bureau...

Our best wishes to PM Tom Takoy who leaves us to take a full time position as a firefighter and

paramedic in Bloomingdale. Tom had been with us the last three years.

We are fortunate to have the Village appoint two new part time paramedics to our ranks. They are PM James Francoeur and PM Ostrand. Both new paramedics currently worked for Rescue 8.

We also had Tony work on Ambulance 6 this past month. He was able with FF/PM Bertoncini work on the latch locking mechanism on the Pediatric compartment. Tony also worked on repairing the rear Arrow stick. The air shoreline was removed from the ceiling above ambulance 6 as the vehicle does not require air.

Ambulance 5 had Tony install 2 litebox hand lights in one of the compartments.

We would like to remind all personnel that when they are exchanging or retrieving drugs from the hospitals, that you check and verify the dosages. With different manufactures and packaging we must make sure that the correct dosages are picked up.

Lutheran General Hospital (LGH) has instituted a new system for inventory control system. We have obtained FOB's so that we can replace linens and supplies.

FF/PM LiRosi has taken over all of the CPR classes and instruction. He will coordinate both the private and the village sector. FF/PM Hudecek, Niemand, Bubis and PM Jenkins and Kosar are all still instructors helping out. We are averaging 3-4 classes per month with 50 plus students.

We have two Northwest Community Hospital paramedic students riding with us. They are currently assigned to riding on Red and Gold. They are in Phase III of their training and observing. The preceptors for Schiller Park are PM Jenkins, FF/PM Leiser, FF/PM Bubis, FF/PM Gergits and EMSD Nosek. The students will be with us until they complete Phase III. Good luck to these men and offer guidance when necessary.

When doing run sheets please verify

that you have the correct incident number. All incident numbers from Schiller Park dispatch are seven digits. Also to help prevent the computers from overheating, leave the lid open.

Worldwide there continues to be a shortage of certain drugs that we administer. It may be impossible to exchange certain drugs at the hospital because of the shortage. I will be coming out with an FYI to inform you of any developments.

Please remember that any unused or empty controlled substance vials must be brought into the hospitals for them to replace. If you have any questions or concerns, please see EMSD Nosek.

Please consult the FYI's on the EMS Clipboard in the kitchen for complete info and updates.

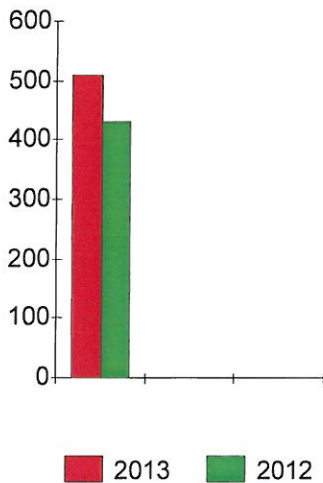

During the past month personnel responded to 121 emergency calls. A total of 128 patients were encountered. 90 patients were transported to area hospitals. 47 patients required Advanced Life Support care.

## Office of the State Fire Marshal and Training

### *Failure to Train is Training to Fail*

The training division has been active in defining and charting a course for our department.

Cmdr. Leiser and Cmdr. Chiodo attended the Training and Safety Officers meeting.

FF/PM Farias and FF/PM Warden attended Fire Apparatus Engineer course at NIPSTA. This is part of the State Fire marshal program. They have signed up for the state exam later this month.

Director Deegan, Cmdr. Leiser and Cmdr. Chiodo attended the NFPA national conference in Chicago.

FF/PM Bubis received his State Fire Marshal Instructor I certificate. This is part of the fire officer one program.

FF/PM Bertoncini attended the MSA class on SCBA repairs. He is one of

the technicians authorized to repair our breathing apparatus.

When training using SCBA, DO NOT drag persons on the bottle. We recently had to take out of service a cylinder that had been dragged and wore through the fiberglass wrapping exposing the aluminum bottle. This can't be repaired and could have been a ticking time bomb with 4500 psi in the bottle.

Members also trained in water safety and rescue with Schiller Park life guards (see photos).

We are in the process of co-hosting a Vehicle Machinery Operations class September 23-27<sup>th</sup>. It will be limited to 20 students and be held in Schiller Park/Northlake. We will have three of our members attending as students and one as an instructor. We hope to have completed teaching certification to train the remaining members of our department.

Cmdr Leiser has received a DVD training simulator where we can use pictures of buildings in town and I will be able to set up different scenarios.

We are looking into the possibility of hosting some State Fire Marshal classes including technical rescue and fire apparatus engineer. I will notify personnel if openings occur.

We will also have in the new future a Fire Service Vehicle Operator class (FSVO).

I have signed up several members for OSFM classes as part of their job requirements. If you know that you need a class please let me know, I will try to find one, however if you find one on your own please submit the paperwork and maintain a copy for yourself.

I have also obtained railroad ties for training in using different techniques for cutting, i.e. chopping with axes, mauls, saws. They are located behind the firehouse.

Members completed 231 hours of training for the month with 25 training drills. This includes outside classes. Our Paid on Call had 4 meetings for

20 hours.

The second Thursday of each month the State Fire Marshal has a testing site at Triton College. They have also instituted a new policy of a government issued picture ID at the test site. If you cannot produce one you will not be allowed in. Likewise they are requesting that all phones be left in the test takers car to help with the integrity of the test (too many camera phones). If you would like to sign up see Cmdr. Leiser.

Please fill an Outside Training Form whenever you attend a class, seminar or training session outside of Schiller Park. This allows for accurate record keeping in those areas and credit for the hours you put into training.

Signing up for tests is considered a Duty Assignment. If you can't attend see me in advance and provide a written response for the absence.

## Employee of the Month

This month two members were nominated and acknowledge as our Employees of the Month—EMSD Nosek, PM Hudacek, FF/PM Bubis.

These are the primary members who helped design our new Ambulance 5 (463). This vehicle replaced the older one which left for Chile July 14<sup>th</sup>.

These members designed, inspected, reviewed and followed up on all aspects of the project. They took input from the rest of the department, visited other fire departments for feedback and brought in the best possible vehicle for both crew needs and patient needs.

For your commitment to our department we are honored to call you our Employee of the Month.

Thanks for your time and dedication, you make us proud to be firefighters and in the fire service and village employees.

## Fire Prevention

### *An Ounce of Prevention is Worth a Pound of Cure*

Shifts are working on their 2013 inspections. Each shift received 1/3 of the inspections or about 135 per shift. The inspections are rotated so that over a three year period each shift should have the opportunity to enter all the businesses. To date about 183 total inspections have been completed.

We may soon see some development in the West Gateway area. A ground breaking for a parking garage was held July 15<sup>th</sup>.

Our Water Department has also requested that on any new or upgraded fire suppression system that the by-pass meter on the backflow protection be either a Neptune or Census water meter. These are compatible with our MXU system.

Please remember on emergency numbers forms to circle which shift the inspection is assigned to. That way it can go in the correct file and may save a re-inspection trip if that was all they required.

We also want to ensure that all PRE-PLAN sheets are returned and handed in to Cmdr. Maher or FF/PM Niemand. These are ESSENTIAL for us to try to complete our computer based pre-plan program. Cmdr. Maher will begin to strictly enforce the policy on completing these documents with possible disciplinary action for non-compliance. When you bring back your fire inspections, make a copy of the pre-plan forms and submit to FF/PM Niemand. He is CAD drawing the diagrams with the information. He is also using satellite imagery in each of the files. This process will take a year of more to import, drawn and download to our laptops. IT IS IMPORTANT TO COMPLETE THIS PAPERWORK AS

IT IS PART OF THE PRE-PLAN THAT IS ISO NECESSARY.

Cmdr. Maher is reviewing several new businesses in town. We have several major projects that are in the works.

If you are interested in any plan review in Fire Prevention, please see me. I will review what is coming into town based on what plans Community Development sends over.

Any member wishing to attend the monthly meeting of the Illinois Fire Inspectors Association should contact Cmdr. Maher.

We are also suggesting and strongly recommending that sprinkler and standpipe connections be converted to stortz fittings. Please consult with Cmdr. Maher.

The State Fire Marshal is instituting a new certification program Inspector I. Cmdr. Leiser is looking into the program if this should replace the Fire Prevention Principles as required before third year of hire. Cmdr.'s Leiser and Maher will advise those needing the class when it is available.

Cmdr. Maher plans on retiring in the near future. As such he is beginning a transition to his replacement Lt. Hatcher. More to follow.

## Public Affairs

### *Saving Lives Through Education*

We have been very pro-active in Public Relations during the past month.

We are participating weekly in the Village Farmer Market at Rog's. We are passing out fire safety literature to those attending. The Association is also selling Wounded Warrior shirts there. We have obtained a pop up tent that we will use at this event and others throughout the year.

Members are also participating in the Monthly Movies in the Park. This past month we watched at Stalica "Batman, Dark Knight". Next month it is Movie at the Schiller Park Pool.

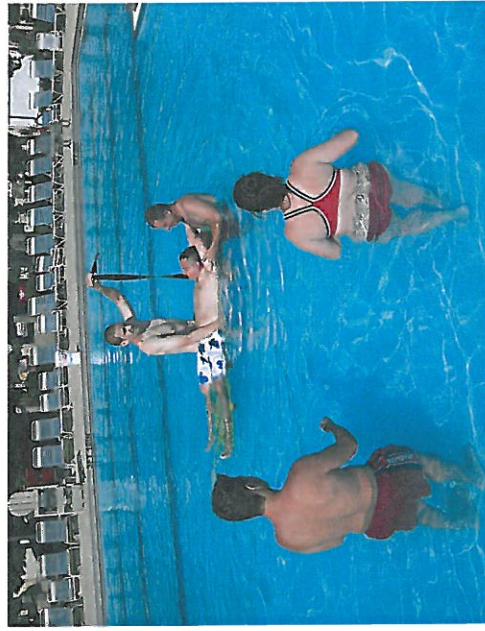

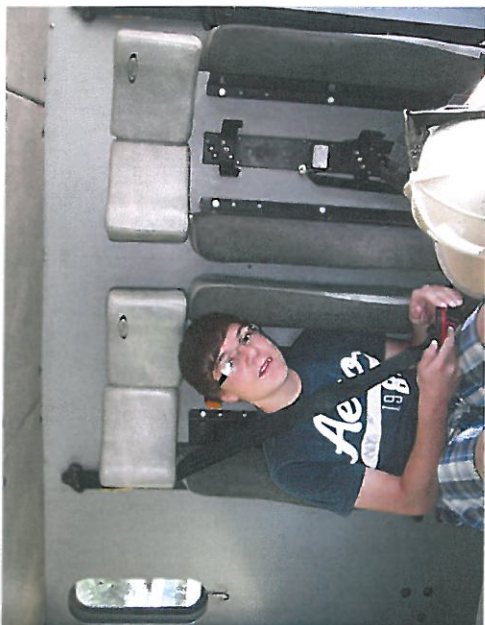
